

DISTRICT 1 MINUTES FOR JUNE

June 1, 2017, 6:30 pm at the Roy Baptist Church

(Corrected to include actual incoming donations on the financial report)

Reading of the traditions and concepts: Lisa read the traditions, Jeff the concepts, and Stephanie the warranties.

Approval of Minutes: Pam moved for approval of the minutes; Lisa seconded. The vote was unanimous.

Alateen – Sunday – Courage to Be Me – Robert: They only had one teen, who decided to join the Al-Anon meeting.

Alateen – Monday- Wisdom Kids & Teens in Action –Michelle: Not present.

Sunday: Serenity Hour- Logan – Pam L : Doing well, self-sufficient, good core group with around 20 attendees and newcomers. Each month they do a book study group meeting too. They have coffee and some members bring in treats or extra produce from their gardens to share.

Sunday: Sunday 4 Serenity – Beth: All is well except the GR (her) is getting burnt out! ☺ She has asked someone else to take the position and they are thinking about it. Robert asked her if just stepping down and leaving the position open would help.

Monday: Courage to Change – Jeff K : Good, usually full room and frequent newcomers, self-sufficient, no issues.

Monday: Unity – Stefani: Not present. Pam said she attended their fundraiser in Morgan last month and it was well attended.

Tuesday: Live & Let Live – Stephanie: Good, small but occasional newcomers, self-supporting.

Wednesday: Hope at High Noon – Jane: No issues, usually 15 to 20 attendees and their newcomers come back. Connie will make donations to other arms of service soon so they are self-supporting.

Wednesday: Serenity Here We Are – Sherri: Good, average 12 to 15 attendees, still doing newcomer meeting each week.

Wednesday: Letting Go-Logan – Susan for John: Self-supporting, 6 to 9 regulars and occasionally a newcomer. They discussed anger and rage and decided to spend more time reading “Understanding Ourselves” from page 26 of the service manual, plus “Health and Hope” on page 27. Susan said that John is doing a very good job as their GR and all their positions are filled. They also have good communication with the church personnel (i.e., key issues).

Friday: Staying Alive – Sandy: Great group, 15 to 20 on average, plus newcomers. They are doing a step and traditions meeting in the hour before the regular meeting and usually have 6 to 10 people attend that.

Saturday CALM – Jan for Sheldon W.: They are doing great; they have regulars plus newcomers. They have some cross talk occasionally but are welcoming to newcomers and so the newcomers open quickly. They are self-supporting. Many stay after the meeting, which can make it difficult for the person assigned to lock up the church.

Saturday: Tri-C's – Jeannie O: Still struggling; only 1 or 2 people per week. The AA group next door is also struggling with poor attendance. Chris mentioned that there is an AA meeting at the Elevation Church at 7 that has a strong attendance rate. Perhaps we should be looking into having a meeting there instead.

Saturday Speaker Meeting – Chris for Cory O: Doing well. Their basket money had been going straight to the district treasury but they need to purchase books, welcome packets and coffee supplies. Jeff is still selling cookies for UTAC.

District Reports:

Public Outreach – Chris for the J-mazing Duo: The big event in June is the Shannon J Scholarship (SJS) event on June 17th. This event is one of the biggest public outreach tools we had last year as it helped us make contact with treatment centers like Brighton. Please call Joanne or Janet if you're willing to help with this awesome cause.

DR – Robert: Who is going to Delegate's Day on Saturday? Who's driving? Beth, Matt and Stephanie are going with Chris. Sandy says she's driving down and can take someone. This assembly is a great way to hear what our delegate, Nancy W., learned at the World Service Conference in Virginia last April. That's why GRs should go so they can take the message back to their groups.

Alternate DR - Chris: Fall Assembly will be a big deal this year as it's the first time in a long while since AA and AI-Anon have had their assembly together. We could use some help: If anyone knows of a dual member who might be willing to speak at the luncheon, please contact her. Also, please contact her if you'd be willing to bring a crockpot of soup or chili for the luncheon as that is how we are keeping the cost low. A prize will be offered for the best of each.

Treasurer – Lisa K: We had \$396.27.incoming and \$375.51 outgoing, which includes the rent for our meeting space). She paid for the coins and sent a note stating that the coins should be self-supporting.

UTAC – Jeff: The fundraising has been successful. Sheldon is concerned with the high water in the river behind the lodge so they need to be really careful to keep the kids away. There are about 30 registrations so far. They have enough female sponsors but could use more male sponsors for the cabins. Also, you don't need to be AMIAS to attend during the day. It's \$30 for a day pass and well worth it. The next UTAC meeting is June 5th at 8:15 PM at the Clearfield Church.
