Our **Zoom fundraiser** is coming up on Saturday, February 27, 2021.



Reaching Out to Help Children of Alcoholics

It was a cold, dark, February night when I came to my first Al-Anon meeting. I was young in years (only a couple years too late for Alateen), but I felt ancient, worn-out, and totally lost in spirit. The effects of my mom's alcoholism had ravaged me, but all I could focus on was my desperate attempt to save her. The members at that meeting welcomed me and assured me I was in the right place. Their stories were different than mine, but they shared the same feelings. I went home that night feeling hope, and as if a thousand pounds had been lifted off my shoulders. I was no longer all alone.

My road toward recovery has not been easy or short, but as members helped me let go of the many coping mechanisms I developed as a child, I began to feel better every day. I can never give back as much as I feel I owe to Al-Anon, but today I do whatever I can. As my Al-Anon anniversary comes around each February, I celebrate it by honoring the kindness of those members who encouraged me by offering that same kindness to other children of alcoholics still in pain. I let them know they are no longer all alone.

How appropriate it is that this year in the US, Children of Alcoholics Week will be held February 14-20, to bring national awareness to the effects of alcoholism on children. Throughout the month, the World Service Office (WSO) will be publishing content to draw attention to the support that Al-Anon and Alateen meetings provide across the globe to adult children of alcoholics and teenagers living in alcoholic homes. It's the perfect time for local service arms and groups to plan special speaker meetings focusing on children of alcoholics, to reach out to local community support agencies about how Al-Anon can help, or to provide Al-Anon speakers for educational meetings held at institutions, facilities, or schools. Individual members can also participate by sharing WSO content on social media. Let's do all we can to let anyone who has been affected by parental alcoholism know that Al-Anon and Alateen can make a difference.

AAIS is Alive and Well and Living in Murray

A Short Introduction for our Newcomers: Al- anon Al-ateen Information Service (AAIS) provides a way to contact Al-anon for newcomers, members, and the community with questions or concerns about Al-anon and our services. AAIS serves all Al-anon members and groups in Utah. AAIS answers the phone 24 hours per day, although we expect late callers are truly experiencing an emotional or spiritual crisis! Call AAIS at (801) 262-9587. The office cum bookstore (it's a closet with windows) is located on the second floor south side of the Alano Club (operated by Alcoholics Anonymous), 5056 S Commerce Drive (300 West), Murray, UT, and currently has "pandemic hours." The office, which is staffed by volunteers, is open Wednesday through Saturday,12 noon to 4 PM.

The AAIS bookstore sells the same Al-anon-Approved literature that is available on line at www.al-anon.org, at the same price. You may purchase Al-anon literature at the AAIS bookstore or order for delivery by calling. The charge for shipping is only the actual postage. Books and pamphlets may be paid for with cash, credit or debit cards, or check.

Objectives of AAIS:

- A. Provide and Maintain an Information Service for all Utah Area Al-Anon groups.
- B. Serve as a point of contact with Al-Anon for the general public, accepting and relaying to the nearest group, pleas for help.
- C. Cooperate with Alcoholics Anonymous in providing information concerning these services.
- D. Act as a Clearinghouse for information on Al-Anon meetings and other activities, maintaining current list and making the information available to all groups and individual members of Al-Anon as well as to visitors and interested parties.

AAIS weathers the pandemic: AAIS is open 16 hours per week now, instead of 36 hours per week. The bookstore is, of course, staffed by volunteers. Enough of us are old enough that we do not want to go out now, hence the limited hours. If you are young and/or perky and would like a very warm and fuzzy experience, please volunteer for one or more 4 hour shifts a month at the bookstore. The office manager has taken impressive precautions to make it a safer environment. Volunteers answer the phone to provide information about meetings around Utah, how Al-anon works, speak with people in need, make book recommendations, and sell books and pamphlets. AAIS operates on donations from Al-anon groups and a small amount of revenue from book sales. The volume of book sales in 2020, dropped by about 50% compared to 2019. If you or your group is able to make a donation to AAIS, we will appreciate it!

Kudos: Heartfelt thanks to the volunteers who have kept this very important lifeline, the AAIS bookstore and telephone service, going through the pandemic. I believe you are risking your lives to bring Experience, Strength, and Hope to people struggling in alcoholic families.

Also thanks to our capable, dedicated, hard-working, clever, and friendly, never-miss-a-beat office manager. He never loses his cool, has a wicked sense of humor; and what's more, the man can add a column of figures correctly. He has a long commute but has kept the bookstore open literally through rain, shine, sleet, and snow; sometimes with a car, sometimes via UTA. He has suffered through Covid quarantine due to a family member's illness, then actual Covid itself. Folks, I don't know how we got this lucky. They don't make 'em like our office manager anymore. So modest, he doesn't want me to print his name.
