A Snaring on Step 2

The second step states that we came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity. When I first looked at this step, I assumed I had already worked it and could skip right ahead to the third. Of course I believed in a god, I grew up in a baptist church, I heard the word all the time in Al-Anon meetings, and I said the serenity prayer. But, while working this step with a sponsor, I realized I was missing something.

The foremost being, I could not describe who or what god was, or if I actually believed in them. In fact, when attempting to describe god, I described a god whose love was extremely conditional, and quite angry. I realized that my perception of my higher power was based out of fear, and not love. And then, through doing step work, praying, and meditating, I was given the insight that my definition of god was entirely my own. My higher power was exactly that, mine. God was going to be as big or as little as I decided.

Then, I did some more work. And more reflection, and more work with my sponsor. It was pointed out to me that if my god was everything or nothing, that god did not disappear because I decided so. Before I entered the rooms of Al-Anon, God was there, and if I were to choose to turn my back on God, God would still be there, loving me unconditionally. By attempting to define God, I was simply stating what I was and was not willing to turn over to god. And therefore, I was limiting my chance of being able to live in a healthy, productive manner, i.e. living with Sanity.

Thanks to working step two, I understand that without even realizing it, I not only came to believe, but developed a faith in a power that extends beyond everything, and that there is not a single person on this earth who has the power to take that from me. Thanks to working step two, I was blessed with the understanding that I can be restored to sanity, and I don't have to be the one to figure it out. I simply have to continue to develop my relationship with my higher power, and pray for knowledge of her will, and the strength to carry it through.

When I Got Busy Volunteering at the Bookstore, I Got Better

As the pamphlet "When I got busy, I got better," suggests, service is an integral piece of Al-Anon recovery. The book How Al-Anon Works, describes service as practicing giving unconditional love. I remembermy first service position, as a Group

The Al-anon Alateen Information Service (AAIS) office and bookstore located in the Alano Club is staffed by volunteers. Answering the phone, selling Al-Anon approved literature, and chatting with members are easy and often rewarding activity. Here are the typical responsibilities:

- 1. Check the log book for messages from your fellow volunteers.
- 2. Check the phone for messages and respond.
- 3. Take book orders from callers.
- 4. Sell books and pamphlets to folks who drop in.
- 5. Chat with your fellow Al-Anons who drop in.

As you can see, only straightforward responsibilities. On average, there are 0 to 10 "events" in a 4-hour shift; ie, not stressful.

Training is available from Chrissy, who manages the AAIS bookstore and 24 hour phone line, and from Lee, an AAIS board member. New volunteers typically spend at least one or two shifts with in-person support. Shifts are 2 or 4 hours between 12 PM and 4 PM on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday. Call the bookstore at (801)-262-9587 to discuss volunteering. You won't be disappointed!

Alateen Rocks! Well, once you get there, it can rock. Once YOU get there. That's right, YOU.

The you to who I am speaking is, that's right, the YOU who is reading Alanews. I know, it should be whom, but "you-who" had a ring to it.

How can you get to Alateen? Begin at <u>www.al-anon.org</u>, this is the World Service Office of the Al-Anon Family Groups, which includes Alateen. They have many different resources and links- follow any of them that applies.

Or go to <u>www.utah-alanon.org</u>, the Utah Area website can link you in with AAPP, AAC, DAPP, DR, GR service members.

Ah, I'm making this hard! I'm sorry! No, I APPOLOGIZE. I apologize for making it harder to get to Alateen.

An Area Alateen Process Person (AAPP) or District Alateen Process Person (DAPP) covers the process of getting your information into Alateen certification. The Al-Anon Area AlateenCoordinator (AAC) assists in getting the forms, information, resources for becoming familiar with and certified in Alateen Service. They usually

Office Board of Trustees put forth as policy in 2003. The Board of Trustees Alateen Motion set the minimum that Al–Anon Areas must comply with to use the name Alateen in their structure and events. Utah is proud to be in compliance with the Alateen Motion.

If you cannot locate the accurate person in these levels of service the Group Representative (GR) of any Al-Anon Family Group can direct you forward to one of them or to the District Representative (DR), who likely works with one or more in the Area World Services.

We all want you in Alateen. An Al-Anon Member Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) will help keep Alateen safe and active. Safe in as far as a place to talk about what life is or was like when alcoholism was acute in their home, what it is like trying to navigate roles in family, school and community with Alateen principles. Safe in as much as there comes a time the child of an alcoholic wants to strike out, because no one, anywhere seems to hear them. Safe in as much as children of alcoholics can be vulnerable to intentions or actions of others affected by alcoholism.

AMIAS must be 21 or older, must be familiar with the Al-Anon program (and have attended for at least 2 years) and must NOT have ever been convicted of a felony or charged with child endangerment. This applies even if they also are members of AA.

An Alateen group has a few steps to take before it can meet. It must have two AMIAS to sponsor the group. It must be registered with the World Service Office before they will share any information with newcomers looking for Alateen (and this comes through the local Area services). The group must have a location, a schedule, and support from Al-Anon groups nearby.

With all this work, you can see why Alateen rocks! And it will rock greater when YOU get there! Will we see you at UTAC (Utah Alateen Conference)? Volunteers are needed!
